ONE HUNDRED AND FOURTH SUPPLEMENTAL EMERGENCY DECLARATION - EXTENSION OF EXECUTIVE ORDERS 20-02, 20-29, 20-39 AND 20-68

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-02 declaring a state of emergency due to the dangers to health and life posed by COVID-19 and that Order is in effect until at least December 31, 2020;

WHEREAS, on April 27, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-29 promoting better coordination on health care coverage and that Order has been extended until December 23, 2020;

WHEREAS, on May 27, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-39 authorizing adjustments to child care subsidies and reimbursement rates and that Order has also been extended until December 23, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on August 28, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-68 setting the minimum weekly base rate for unemployment insurance and that Order has been extended until December 23, 2020.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GINA M. RAIMONDO, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Rhode Island, pursuant to Article IX of the Rhode Island



Constitution and the Rhode Island General Laws, including, but not limited to, Title 30, Chapter 15, do hereby extend the following Executive Orders:

- 1. Executive Order 20-02 (Declaration of Disaster Emergency).
- 2. Executive Order 20-29 (Twenty-Sixth Supplemental Emergency Declaration Promoting Better Coordination of Health Care Coverage).
- 3. Executive Order 20-39 (Thirty-Sixth Supplemental Emergency Declaration Authorizing adjustments to Child Care Subsidies and Reimbursement Rates).
- 4. Executive Order 20-68 (Sixty-Third Supplemental Emergency Declaration Setting the Minimum Weekly Base Rate for Unemployment Insurance).

This Executive Order shall take effect immediately and remain in full force and effect until January 20, 2021 unless renewed, modified or terminated by subsequent Executive Order.
