ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTIETH SUPPLEMENTAL EMERGENCY DECLARATION – EXTENSION OF EXECUTIVE ORDERS 20-02, 20-29 AND 20-39

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-02 declaring a state of emergency due to the dangers to health and life posed by COVID-19 and that Order is in effect until at least February 17, 2021;

WHEREAS, on April 27, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-29 promoting better coordination on health care coverage and that Order has been extended until February 17, 2021; and

WHEREAS, on May 27, 2020, I issued Executive Order 20-39 authorizing adjustments to child care subsidies and reimbursement rates and that Order has also been extended until February 17, 2021.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, GINA M. RAIMONDO, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Rhode Island, pursuant to Article IX of the Rhode Island Constitution and the Rhode Island General Laws, including, but not limited to, Title 30, Chapter 15, do hereby extend the following Executive Orders:

- 1. Executive Order 20-02 (Declaration of Disaster Emergency).
- 2. Executive Order 20-29 (Twenty-Sixth Supplemental Emergency Declaration Promoting Better Coordination of Health Care Coverage).
- 3. Executive Order 20-39 (Thirty-Sixth Supplemental Emergency Declaration Authorizing adjustments to Child Care Subsidies and Reimbursement Rates).

This Executive Order shall take effect immediately and remain in full force and effect until March 17, 2021 unless renewed, modified or terminated by a subsequent Executive Order.
